An Explanation of Our Communion Practice

Today we are celebrating the Lord's Supper, which is a wonderful gift from our gracious God. In his Word, God teaches that Christians need a proper understanding of the Lord's Supper before receiving it (1 Corinthians 11:27-29). He also tells us that Christians should be completely united before communing together (1 Corinthians 10:17). Therefore, we ask that only members of our fellowship (The Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod and, worldwide, The Confessional Evangelical Lutheran Conference) commune at Trinity.

We do want everyone to commune with us. So that everything may be done decently and in good order (1 Corinthians 14:40), we ask for the opportunity to verify that we are united in our beliefs based on God's Word, and then to celebrate that unity publicly in the Sacrament. If you would like to learn more, please speak to Pastor. Thank you for your understanding of our belief and practice.



FIRST LESSON AND SERMON TEXT

MICAH 5:2-5A

But you, Bethlehem Ephrathah,

though you are small among the clans of Judah,

from you, will go out the one who will be the ruler for me in Israel.

until the time when the woman who is in labor bears a child.

SECOND LESSON

REVELATION 12:1-6

God keeps the Church (the woman) safe from the devil (the dragon) in every age. She gives birth to the Messiah, who accomplishes God's salvation before returning to his side in heaven.

A great sign appeared in the sky: a woman clothed with the sun, with the moon under her feet and a crown of twelve stars on her head. ² She was pregnant, and she cried out in pain and agony as she gave birth.

³ Another sign also appeared in the sky: There was a huge red dragon that had seven heads and ten horns and seven crowns on his heads. ⁴ His tail swept away a third of the stars in the sky and threw them to the earth. The dragon stood before the woman, who was about to give birth, so that he could devour the child as soon as it was born.

⁵ She gave birth to a son, a male child, who will shepherd all the nations with an iron rod. Her child was snatched up to God and to his throne. ⁶ Then the woman fled into the wilderness, where she has a place prepared by God in order that she might be fed there for 1,260 days.

Luke 1:39-55

God chooses Mary to give birth to the Messiah, who will bring peace between God and his people.

In those days Mary got up and hurried to the hill country, to a town of Judah. ⁴⁰ She entered the home of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth. ⁴¹ Just as Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the baby leaped in her womb, and Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit. ⁴² She called out with a loud voice and said, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb! ⁴³ But why am I so favored that the mother of my Lord should come to me? ⁴⁴ In fact, just now, as soon as the sound of your greeting reached my ears, the baby in my womb leaped for joy! ⁴⁵ Blessed is she who believed, because the promises spoken to her from the Lord will be fulfilled!"

⁵³ He has filled the hungry with good things, but the rich he has sent away empty.


⁵⁴ He has come to the aid of his servant Israel, remembering his mercy,


WORDS OF INSTITUTION





Christmas Worship Schedule

Christmas Eve worship will be at 5 and 7 (same service at both times). Christmas Day worship is at 9am, and will include the celebration of Jesus' Supper.

New Worship Schedule Starts January 2

Beginning Sunday, January 2 Trinity will return to two Sunday morning worship services. The first service will be at 8:30. At this service:

- -- masks are optional
- -- offering plates will be passed
- -- Communion will be distributed hand-to-hand, with the chalice available to those who want it
- -- children will be invited to come forward for the children's sermon

The second service will be at 11:00. At this service:

- -- masks are required
- -- offerings will be placed in the plates at the entrance to the sanctuary
- -- Communion will be distributed from distance
- -- children will remain in their pews for the children's sermon

Bible class and Sunday School will begin at 9:45. Masks are optional during Bible study. Sunday School will continue following Prince William County's Public Schools' guidance on masking. Adult Bible class will continue to be repeated online each Wednesday night (Thursdays during Lent) at 7pm for those unable to attend in person on Sunday morning.

Please understand that a main reason for adding a second, "covid-conscience" service is to make in-person worship more accessible for Trinity's members and guests who have been held away for over eighteen months by covid concerns. Therefore, the rules for the second service will be enforced in the building beginning at 10:50am. Please make life easy and not burdensome for your pastor for and your brothers and sisters in Christ attending the late service; if you're still in the building at 10:50, please be wearing a mask over your nose and mouth. If you forget, you will be reminded please to mask up or please to exit. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation, and for taking these words in the kindest possible way.
