

An Explanation of Our Communion Practice

Today we are celebrating the Lord's Supper, which is a wonderful gift from our gracious God. In his Word, God teaches that Christians need a proper understanding of the Lord's Supper before receiving it (1 Corinthians 11:27-29). He also tells us that Christians should be completely united before communing together (1 Corinthians 10:17). Therefore, we ask that only members of our fellowship (The Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod and, worldwide, The Confessional Evangelical Lutheran Conference) commune at Trinity.

We do want everyone to commune with us. So that everything may be done decently and in good order (1 Corinthians 14:40), we ask for the opportunity to verify that we are united in our beliefs based on God's Word, and then to celebrate that unity publicly in the Sacrament. If you would like to learn more, please speak to Pastor. Thank you for your understanding of our belief and practice.


Tonight's Focus:



CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

M: Beloved in the Lord, let us draw near with a true heart and confess our sins to God, who has shown us grace upon grace and truth in his Son.

- C: Most merciful God, we confess that we have not fully appreciated the grace you poured out on us through the birth, life, death, and resurrection of your Son, our Lord Jesus Christ. Because we have sinned against you and our neighbors, we deserve all the condemnation of the law that you gave through Moses. But for the sake of Jesus forgive us, restore us, and lead to appreciate fully the grace you have given us.
- M: Almighty God in his mercy has given his Son to die for you; for his sake God does forgive all your sins. As a called servant of Christ, and by his authority, I therefore forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the (+) Son and of the Holy Spirit.

FIRST LESSON

Exodus 33:18-23; 34:5-7

The Lord hides his full glory from Moses, but proclaims his grace. Jesus comes to reveal the full extent of God's grace to the human race.

Then Moses said, "Please show me your glory."

¹⁹ The Lord said, "I will make all my goodness pass in front of you, and I will proclaim the name of the Lord in your presence. I will be gracious to whom I will be gracious, and I will show mercy to whom I will show mercy." ²⁰ He said, "You cannot see my face, for no human may see me and live."

²¹ The Lord also said, "Look, there is a place next to me, where you shall stand on the rock. ²² It will happen that, while my glory passes by, I will put you in a crevice in the rock. I will cover you with my hand until I have passed by. ²³ Then I will take away my hand, and you will see my back. But my face will not be seen."

The Lord came down in the cloud. He took his stand there with Moses and proclaimed the name of the Lord. ⁶ The Lord passed by in front of him and proclaimed: "The Lord, the Lord, the compassionate and gracious God, slow to anger, and overflowing with mercy and truth, ⁷ maintaining mercy for thousands, forgiving guilt and rebellion and sin. He will by no means clear the guilty. He calls their children and their children's children to account for the guilt of the fathers, even to the third and the fourth generation."

SECOND LESSON

HEBREWS 1:1-9

Jesus is God, and therefore worthy of all the glory and honor of God.

In the past, God spoke to our forefathers by the prophets at many times and in many ways. ² In these last days, he has spoken to us by his Son, whom he appointed heir of all things, and through whom he made the universe. ³ The Son is the radiance of God's glory and the exact imprint of the divine nature. He sustains all things by his powerful word. After he had provided purification for sins, he took his seat at the right hand of the Majesty on high.

⁴The Son became as much superior to the angels as the name he has inherited is more excellent than theirs. ⁵ For to which of the angels did God ever say:

You are my Son. Today I have begotten you?

And again:

I will be his Father, and he will be my Son.

⁶ And again, when he brought his firstborn into the world, he said:

Let all God's angels worship him.

⁷ About the angels he says:

He makes his messengers winds and his ministers flaming fire.

⁸ But about the Son he says:

God, your throne is forever and ever, and the scepter of righteousness is the scepter of your kingdom.

9 You have loved righteousness and hated wickedness.

Therefore God, your God, has anointed you with the oil of joy beyond your companions.

GOSPEL AND SERMON TEXT

JOHN 1:1-18

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ² He was with God in the beginning. ³ Through him everything was made, and without him not one thing was made that has been made. ⁴ In him was life, and the life was the light of mankind. ⁵ The light is shining in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.

⁶There was a man, sent from God, whose name was John. ⁷He came as an eyewitness to testify about the light so that everyone would believe through him. ⁸He was not the light, but he came to testify about the light.

⁹The real light that shines on everyone was coming into the world. ¹⁰ He was in the world, and the world was made through him, yet the world did not recognize him. ¹¹ He came to what was his own, yet his own people did not accept him. ¹² But to all who did receive him, to those who believe in his name, he gave the right to become children of God. ¹³ They were born, not of blood, or of the desire of the flesh, or of a husband's will, but born of God.

¹⁴ The Word became flesh and dwelled among us. We have seen his glory, the glory he has as the only-begotten from the Father, full of grace and truth.

¹⁵ John testified about him. He cried out, "This was the one I spoke about when I said, 'The one coming after me outranks me because he existed before me.'" ¹⁶ For out of his fullness we have all received grace upon grace. ¹⁷ For the law was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. ¹⁸ No one has ever seen God. The only-begotten Son, who is close to the Father's side, has made him known.

NICENE CREED

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God,
eternally begotten of the Father,
God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God,
begotten, not made,
of one being with the Father.

For us and for our salvation, he came down from heaven,
was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the virgin Mary,
and became fully human.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate.

and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in one holy Christian and apostolic Church.

We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.

We look for the resurrection of the dead

and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Christian Giving is Proportionate

God does not distribute his gifts equally. To some he gives more, to others less. This is true of all his gifts, including wealth. So, when St. Paul instructs the Corinthians on giving, he instructs them to give in keeping with their income (1 Corinthians 16:2). Those to whom God has given more return more in thanksgiving, and those to whom he gives less return less. Far more important than the amount of an offering is that it's given the right way: with a heart of joyful thanks for all of God's gifts.
