PASTOR'S GREETING AND INTRODUCTION TO WORSHIP

CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

M: Brothers and sisters in Christ: God created us to know joy in communion with him, to love all humanity, and to live in harmony with all creation. But sin separates us from God, our neighbors, and creation, and so we do not enjoy the life our Creator intended for us. By our sin we grieve our Father, who does not desire us to come under his judgment but to turn from our sin and live. Therefore, God in his mercy has sent our Lord Jesus Christ to take our place under the law, to suffer for us, and to die the death we deserve. God made Jesus, who had no sin, to be sin for us so that in him, we might become the righteousness of God.

During the forty days of Lent, we fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfector of our faith, who for the joy set before him endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of God. The time of Lent reminds us that to know Christ and the power of his resurrection, we must also know the fellowship of sharing in his sufferings, become like him in his death. As disciples of the Lord Jesus, we are called to struggle against everything that leads us away from love of God and neighbor.

I invite you, therefore, to confess your sins, using the words of King David's great penitential Psalm. Let us ask our Father for forgiveness, and commit ourselves to this struggle. First, let us be silent and still, pausing for a time of reflection and self-examination.

Silence

C: Be gracious to me, O God, according to your mercy.

Erase my acts of rebellion according to the greatness of your compassion.

Scrub me clean of my guilt.

Purify me from sin.


For I admit my rebellious acts. My sin is always in front of me. Against you, you only, have I sinned, and I have done this evil in your eyes. So you are justified when you sentence me. You are blameless when you judge. Certainly, I was sinful when I was born. I was sinful when my mother conceived me. Since you desire truth on the inside, in my hidden heart you teach me wisdom.

Remove my sin with hyssop, and I will be clean. Wash me, and I will be whiter than snow. Let me hear joy and gladness. Let the bones you have crushed celebrate. Hide your face from my sins. Erase all my guilty deeds. Create in me a pure heart, O God. Renew an unwavering spirit within me. Do not cast me from your presence. Do not take your Holy Spirit from me. Restore to me the joy of your salvation. Sustain me with a willing spirit.

M: Almighty God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, does not desire the death of sinners but rather that they turn from their wickedness and live. Therefore, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the (+) Son and of the Holy Spirit. During these days of Lent, let us implore God to give us renewal and his Holy Spirit. May we continue to abide in the true faith and at last be received by him through the merits of Jesus Christ our Lord.

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THE WORD

LESSON

Revelation 3:14-22

Those who take pride in their wealth become lukewarm to the Lord. Repentant hearts find lasting riches in God's promises.

To the messenger of the church in Laodicea write:

The Amen, the faithful and true witness, the ruler of God's creation, says this:

¹⁵ I know your works, that you are neither cold nor hot. If only you were cold or hot! ¹⁶ So, because you are lukewarm and not hot or cold, I am about to spit you out of my mouth. ¹⁷ You say, "I am rich. I have become very wealthy and need nothing." But you do not know that you are miserable, pitiful, poor, blind, and naked. ¹⁸ I advise you to buy from me gold refined by fire, so that you may be rich, and white garments, so that you may be clothed and the shame of your nakedness may not become public, and salve to anoint your eyes, so that you may see.

¹⁹ I rebuke and discipline those whom I love. So take this seriously and repent.

²⁰ Look, I stand at the door and I am knocking. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will go in with him and dine with him, and he with me. ²¹ To the one who is victorious I will give the right to sit with me on my throne, just as I was victorious and sat down with my Father on his throne.

²² Whoever has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches.

Luke 18:9-14

Jesus told this parable to certain people who trusted in themselves (that they were righteous) and looked down on others: ¹⁰ "Two men went up to the temple courts to pray. One was a Pharisee, and the other was a tax collector. ¹¹ The Pharisee stood and prayed about himself like this: 'God, I thank you that I am not like other people, robbers, evildoers, adulterers, or even like this tax collector. ¹² I fast twice a week. I give a tenth of all my income.'

¹³ "However the tax collector stood at a distance and would not even lift his eyes up to heaven, but was beating his chest and saying, 'God, be merciful to me, a sinner!'

¹⁴ "I tell you, this man went home justified rather than the other, because everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted."

SERMON

Theme: "His Mercy is Great"

2 Samuel 24:10-25

David had a guilty conscience after he had counted the fighting men. So David said to the Lord, "I have sinned greatly in what I have done. But, Lord, please take away the guilt of your servant, because I have acted very foolishly."

¹¹When David got up in the morning, the word of the Lord came to Gad the prophet, David's seer. The Lord said, ¹² "Go tell David, 'This is what the Lord says. I am laying out three choices before you. Choose one of them for yourself, and I will carry it out against you.'"

¹³ So Gad went to David and told him about this. He said, "Shall seven years of famine in your land come upon you, or three months of fleeing with your enemies pursuing you, or three days of plague in your land? Now consider this and decide what answer I should return to the one who sent me."

¹⁴ David said to Gad, "This puts me in a difficult position. Please! Let us fall into the hand of the Lord, for his mercy is great. But do not let me fall into the hands of man."

¹⁵ So the Lord sent a plague against Israel from the next morning until the appointed time. Seventy thousand people from Dan to Beersheba died. ¹⁶ The angel stretched out his hand toward Jerusalem to destroy it, but the Lord relented and did not bring the disaster. He said to the angel who was carrying out the destruction among the people, "Enough. Now hold back your hand." The angel of the Lord was near the threshing floor of Araunah the Jebusite.

¹⁷ David said to the Lord, as he was watching the angel striking the people, "Look! I am the one who sinned. I am guilty. But these sheep—what have they done? Please! Let your hand be against me and against the house of my father."

¹⁸ Gad came to David on that day and said to him, "Go up and build an altar to the Lord on the threshing floor of Araunah the Jebusite." ¹⁹ So David went up and obeyed Gad's instructions as the Lord had commanded.

²⁰ Araunah looked up and saw the king and his servants coming toward him. So Araunah went out and bowed down to the king with his face to the ground, ²¹ and he said, "Why has my lord the king come to his servant?"

David said, "To purchase the threshing floor from you, in order to build an altar to the Lord, so the plague will be held back from the people."

²² Araunah said to David, "My lord the king can take it and offer whatever seems good to him. Here are oxen for the burnt offering, as well as the threshing sledges and the yokes of the oxen for the wood. ²³ O King, Araunah is giving all this to the king." Araunah also said to the king, "The Lord your God will accept you."

²⁴ But the king said to Araunah, "No. I insist on purchasing it from you for what it is worth. I will not offer to the Lord my God burnt offerings that I did not pay for."

So David purchased the threshing floor and the oxen for fifty shekels of silver. ²⁵ He built an altar to the Lord and offered burnt offerings and fellowship offerings there. The Lord heard the requests for the land, and the plague was held back from Israel.

- M: Holy and righteous God, as we begin again the solemn spiritual journey of Lent, we come before you in deep humility. You reveal yourself not only as a God of holiness and justice but as a God of mercy and love. Despairing of our own merit and worthiness, we trust in your forgiving love.
- C: Lord, have mercy on us for your holy name's sake.
- M: You have revealed your love and mercy for us sinners in Jesus Christ, your Son, our Savior. You sent him into our world to be the atoning sacrifice for the sins of all people. Help us grasp by faith the great truth that the pain and suffering, the mockery and ridicule, and the death and punishment he endured should have been ours. Help us understand the incomprehensible love he showed in suffering and dying for us.
- C: Lord, have mercy on us for Jesus' sake.
- M: In silent meditation let us reflect and praise our Savior for the forgiveness he has won for us, and ask for God's continued grace to remove any doubt that we are fully forgiven.

Silent meditation

- M: God of grace and mercy, may your Spirit continue to be with us as we follow the way of the cross. As we contemplate the story of our Savior's passion, build us up in our faith. Renew in us the zeal to serve you by reflecting your love in our lives. Give us the desire and ability to proclaim boldly the grace in which we stand, so that all for whom you lived and died may join us in fellowship now and in your presence forever.
- C: We offer our humble thanks and praise, our prayers and petitions, and ourselves in body and spirit to you, Lord God. Hear us, according to your promise, for Jesus' sake.




