
PASTOR'S GREETING AND INTRODUCTION TO WORSHIP

- C: Amen.

CONFESSION OF SINS

- M: Let us confess our sins, trusting only in the mercy of God in the merit of Jesus Christ for forgiveness, pardon, and peace.
- C: Holy Lord, just God, merciful Father, I have sinned against you with my body and life, in the pursuit of my own pleasures, in rejection of your expectations, in selfish thoughts, thoughtless words, and faithless actions. By my own efforts, I have earned death upon death. But Jesus, your Son, gave up his life and died my death, took my sins to the grave and rose victorious. Trusting in him I pray: Have mercy on me, a sinner.
- M: The wages of sin is death;
- C: but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord. (Romans 6:23)
- M: Fellow redeemed, see Jesus, now crowned with glory and honor because he suffered death, so that by the grace of God he might taste death for everyone. *(Hebrews 2:9)*

He appeared once for all at the culmination of the ages to do away with sin by the sacrifice of himself. *(Hebrews 9:26)*

Therefore, by Christ's command and with his authority, I say to you what God says to you: Your sins are all forgiven in the name of the Father and of the (+) Son and of the Holy Spirit.

THE WORD

FIRST LESSON

1 Kings 17:17-24

Through his prophet, the Lord raises a son to life and gives the boy back to his mother.

After these events, the son of the woman who owned the house became ill. The illness became worse until he stopped breathing.

¹⁸ Then she said to Elijah, "What is the issue between us, man of God? Have you come to remind me of my sins and to kill my son?"

¹⁹ He said to her, "Bring your son to me." Then he took him and carried him to the upstairs room where he was living, and he laid him on his bed. ²⁰ Then he cried out to the LORD, "O LORD, my God, have you sent tragedy on this woman with whom I am staying by killing her son?"

²¹ Then he stretched himself out on the boy three times, and he cried out to the LORD, "O LORD, my God, let this boy's soul return to his body!" ²² The LORD listened to Elijah's voice, and the boy's soul returned to his body, and he came to life. ²³ Then Elijah took the boy and brought him down to the house from his upstairs room, and he gave him to his mother.

Elijah said, "See, your son is alive!"

²⁴ The woman said to Elijah, "Now I know that you are a man of God and that the word of the LORD in your mouth is true."

PSALM 30

READ RESPONSIVELY

- M: Sing to the LORD, you saints of his;

SECOND LESSON

Philippians 1:18b-26

Life from the Son of God carries on even through physical death. This causes the Christian's heart to say, "Yes, for me to live is Christ, and to die is gain."

Yes, and I will continue to rejoice, ¹⁹ because I know that this will turn out for my deliverance, through your prayer and the support of the Spirit of Jesus Christ. ²⁰ This matches my earnest expectation and hope that I will in no way be put to shame, but with all boldness, as always, so even now, Christ will be magnified in my body, whether by life or by death. ²¹ Yes, for me to live is Christ, and to die is gain. ²² But if I am to go on living in the flesh, that will mean fruitful labor for me. Yet which should I prefer? I do not know. ²³ I am pulled in two directions, because I have the desire to depart and be with Christ, which is better by far. ²⁴ But, it is more necessary for your sake

that I remain in the flesh. ²⁵ And since I am convinced of this, I know that I will remain and will continue with all of you, for your progress and joy in the faith. ²⁶ And so by my coming to you again, my goal is to give you even more reason to boast in Christ Jesus.

M: Come, Holy Spirit! Fill the hearts of your faithful people, and kindle in us the fire of your love. Alleluia!

GOSPEL AND SERMON TEXT

Luke 7:11-17

Soon afterward Jesus went on his way to a town called Nain, and his disciples and a large crowd were traveling with him. ¹² As he was approaching the town gate, there was a dead man being carried out, the only son of his mother. She was a widow, and a considerable crowd from the town was with her. ¹³ When the Lord saw her, he had compassion on her and said to her, "Do not cry." ¹⁴ He went up to the open coffin, touched it, and the pallbearers stopped. He said, "Young man, I say to you, get up!" ¹⁵ The dead man sat up and began to speak, and Jesus gave him to his mother.

¹⁶ Fear gripped all of them, and they glorified God, saying, "A great prophet has arisen among us" and "God has visited his people!" ¹⁷ This was reported about him in all of Judea and in all the surrounding countryside.

the holy Christian Church,



C: Thanks be to God.


