An Explanation of Our Communion Practice

Today we are celebrating the Lord's Supper, which is a wonderful gift from our gracious God. In his Word, God teaches that Christians need a proper understanding of the Lord's Supper before receiving it (1 Corinthians 11:27-29). He also tells us that Christians should be completely united before communing together (1 Corinthians 10:17). Therefore, we ask that only members of our fellowship (The Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod and, worldwide, The Confessional Evangelical Lutheran Conference) commune at Trinity.

We do want everyone to commune with us. So that everything may be done decently and in good order (1 Corinthians 14:40), we ask for the opportunity to verify that we are united in our beliefs based on God's Word, and then to celebrate that unity publicly in the Sacrament. 

THE WORD

FIRST LESSON

2 Kings 11:1-3, 12-18

When Athalia opposes the Lord's word and will, she creates a very literal sword of division.

When Athaliah, the mother of Ahaziah, saw that her son was dead, she went into action and destroyed all the royal heirs. ² But Jehosheba, King Joram's daughter and Ahaziah's sister, took Joash, the son of Ahaziah. She stole him away from among the king's sons, who were to be killed. She put him and his nurse in a bedroom. He was kept hidden from Athaliah so that he was not killed. ³ He was kept hidden with her in the House of the LORD for six years while Athaliah was ruling over the land.

¹² Then Jehoiada brought out the king's son and set the crown on him and gave him the Testimony, and they made him king. They anointed him and clapped their hands and said, "Long live the king!"

¹³ When Athaliah heard the noise of the guards and the people, she went to them in the House of the LORD. ¹⁴ She looked, and there was the king standing beside the pillar according to the custom, and the officers and the trumpeters were in front of the king, and all the people of the land were celebrating and blowing trumpets. Then Athaliah tore her clothes and cried, "Treason! Treason!" ¹⁵ Then Jehoiada the priest commanded the officers in charge of the units of the army, "Bring her out between the ranks! Anyone who follows her is to be put to death with the sword!"

Because the priest had said, "She is not to be killed in the House of the LORD," ¹⁶ they laid hands on her as she was going through the passageway where the horses enter the king's palace, and they killed her there.

¹⁷ Then Jehoiada made a covenant between the LORD and the king and people that they would be the LORD's people. He also made a covenant between the king and the people. ¹⁸ Then all the people of the land went to the temple of Baal and tore it down. They smashed its altar and its idols till they were dust. They also killed Mattan the priest of Baal in front of the altars. Then the priest posted a watch over the House of the LORD.

SECOND LESSON

Ephesians 6:10-20

St. Paul encourages Christians to stand firm in opposition to all forces that oppose the Lord and his Word. He also asks for their prayers to strengthen him to continue speaking the Lord's Word faithfully, even in the face of unbelieving opposition.

Finally, be strong in the Lord and in his mighty power. ¹¹Put on the full armor of God, so that you can stand against the schemes of the Devil. ¹²For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the world rulers of this darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places. ¹³For this reason, take up the full armor of God, so that you will be able to take a stand on the evil day and, after you have done everything, to stand. ¹⁴Stand, then, with the belt of truth buckled around your waist, with the breastplate of righteousness fastened in place, ¹⁵ and with the readiness that comes from the gospel of peace tied to your feet like sandals. ¹⁶At all times hold up the shield of faith, with which you will be able to extinguish all the flaming arrows of the Evil One. ¹⁷Also take the helmet of salvation and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God.

¹⁸ At every opportunity, pray in the Spirit with every kind of prayer and petition. Stay alert for the same reason, always persevering in your intercession for all the saints. ¹⁹ Pray for me also, that when I open my mouth a message will be given to me that boldly reveals the mystery of the gospel, ²⁰ for which I am an ambassador in chains. Pray that I may speak about it boldly, as it is necessary for me to speak.

VERSE OF THE DAY

M: Alleluia! The Word of God is living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword, discerning the thoughts and attitudes of the heart. Alleluia! *(Hebrews 4:12)*

Luke 12:49-53

M: The Gospel according to St. Luke, chapter 12.

"I came to throw fire on the earth, and how I wish it were already ignited. ⁵⁰ But I have a baptism to undergo, and how distressed I am until it is finished! ⁵¹ Do you think that I came to bring peace on the earth? No, I tell you, but rather division. ⁵² Yes, from now on there will be five divided in one household: three against two, and two against three. ⁵³ They will be divided: father against son, and son against father; mother against daughter, and daughter against mother; mother-in-law against her mother-in-law."

M: The Gospel of our Lord.




WORDS OF INSTITUTION




