
PASTOR'S GREETING AND INTRODUCTION TO WORSHIP

CONFESSION OF SINS

- M: If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us.
- C: If we confess our sins, God is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness.
- M: Let us confess our sins to the Lord.
- C: Holy God, gracious Father, I am sinful by nature and have sinned against you in my thoughts, words, and actions. I have not loved you with my whole heart; I have not loved others as I should. I deserve your punishment both now and forever. But Jesus, my Savior, paid for my sins with his innocent suffering and death. Trusting in him, I pray: God, have mercy on me, a sinner.

ABSOLUTION

- M: Our gracious Father in heaven has been merciful to us. He sent his only Son, Jesus Christ, who gave his life as the atoning sacrifice for the sins of the whole world. Therefore, as a called servant of Christ and by his authority, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the (+) Son and of the Holy Spirit.

THE WORD

FIRST LESSON

Acts 15:12-22

St. Luke reports the role of St. James at the Jerusalem Council, which will be explained further during the sermon.

The whole assembly fell silent and listened to Barnabas and Paul, who reported all the signs and wonders God had done among the Gentiles through them.

¹³ After they finished speaking, James responded, "Gentlemen, brothers, listen to me. ¹⁴ Simon has reported how God for the first time has visited the Gentiles, to take from them a people for his name. ¹⁵ The words of the prophets agree with this, as it is written:

¹⁶ After these things I will return and rebuild David's fallen tent.I will rebuild its ruins, and I will restore it,

¹⁷ so that the rest of mankind may seek the Lord even all the Gentiles who are called by my name, says the Lord who does these things.

¹⁸ "Long ago he made these things known. ¹⁹ So it is my judgment that we should not cause extra difficulty for those among the Gentiles who are turning to God. ²⁰ Instead we should write a letter telling them to abstain from things polluted by idols, from sexual immorality, from what is strangled, and from blood. ²¹ For from ancient times Moses has had those who proclaim him in every city, since he is being read in the synagogues every Sabbath."

²² Then the apostles and the elders, together with the whole church, thought it would be best to choose men from their group to send to Antioch along with Paul and Barnabas, namely, Judas, called Barsabbas, and Silas, who were leading men among the brothers.

PSALM: 1

READ RESPONSIVELY

M: Blessed is the man who does not walk in the council of the wicked

C: or stand in the way of sinners.

- M: But his delight is in the law of the LORD,
- C: and on his law he meditates day and night.
- M: He is like a tree planted by streams of water, which yields its fruit in season

C: and whose leaf does not wither. Whatever he does prospers.

M: Therefore the wicked will not stand in the judgment,

C: nor sinners in the assembly of the righteous.

M: For the LORD watches over the way of the righteous,

C: but the way of the wicked will perish.

SECOND LESSON

James 1:1-12

The opening verses of St. James' letter set the tone for his entire message: Christians are to put their faith on display through perseverance, prayer, and humility.

James, a servant of God and of the Lord Jesus Christ, To the twelve tribes who are scattered abroad:

Greetings.

² Consider it complete joy, my brothers, whenever you fall into various kinds of trials, ³ because you know that the testing of your faith produces patient endurance. ⁴ And let patient endurance finish its work, so that you may be mature and complete, not lacking anything.

⁵ If any one of you lacks wisdom, let him ask God, who gives it to all without reservation and without finding fault, and it will be given to him. ⁶ But let him ask in faith, without doubting, because the one who doubts is like a wave of the sea, blown and tossed by the wind. ⁷ In fact, that person should not expect that he will receive anything from the Lord. ⁸ He is a double-minded man, unstable in all his ways.

⁹Let the brother of humble circumstances boast in his high position, ¹⁰ and the rich one in his humble position, because he will pass away like a flower of the grass. ¹¹Indeed, the sun rises with burning heat and dries up the grass. Its blossom falls off, and its beauty perishes. In the same way also, the rich person will wither away in his busy pursuits.

¹² Blessed is the man who endures a trial patiently, because when he has stood the test, he will receive the crown of life, which God promised to those who love him.

GOSPEL AND SERMON TEXT

Matthew 13:54-58

Jesus entered his hometown and taught in their synagogue. As a result, the people were amazed and said, "Where did this fellow get this wisdom and these miracles? ⁵⁵ Isn't this the carpenter's son? Isn't his mother named Mary? And aren't James, Joseph, Simon, and Judas his brothers? ⁵⁶ And aren't all of his sisters here with us? Where then did this fellow get all of these things?" ⁵⁷ And they took offense at him.

But Jesus said to them, "A prophet is not without honor, except in his own hometown and in his own house." ⁵⁸ He did not do many miracles there because of their unbelief.

- C: Amen.


