

FIRST LESSON

2 SAMUEL 22:1-7

David praised the Lord for saving him from all his enemies. We do, too.

David spoke the words of this song to the LORD on the day when the LORD had delivered him from the grasp of all his enemies, even from the grasp of Saul. ² He said:

SECOND LESSON

Ephesians 5:1-9

Those whom Christ has freed from the darkness walk in the light and leave evil behind.

Therefore, be imitators of God as his dearly loved children. ² And walk in love, just as Christ loved us and gave himself for us, as a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God.

³ But do not let sexual immorality, any kind of impurity, or greed even be mentioned among you, as is proper for saints. ⁴ Obscenity, foolish talk, and coarse joking are also out of place. Instead, give thanks. ⁵ Certainly you are aware of this: No immoral, impure, or greedy person—such a person is an idolater—has an inheritance in the kingdom of Christ, who is God. ⁶ Let no one deceive you with empty words. It is because of these things that the wrath of God is coming on the sons of disobedience. ⁷ So do not share in what they do.

⁸ For you were once darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. Walk as children of light, ⁹ for the fruit of the light consists in all goodness, righteousness, and truth.

GOSPEL AND SERMON TEXT

Luke 11:14-26

Jesus drove out a demon, which was mute. After the demon had gone out, the man who had been mute spoke, and the crowds were amazed. ¹⁵ But some of them said, "He drives out demons by Beelzebul, the ruler of the demons." ¹⁶ Others were testing him by demanding of him a sign from heaven. ¹⁷ But he knew their thoughts and said to them, "Every kingdom divided against itself is destroyed. And a house divided against itself falls. ¹⁸ If Satan is divided against himself, how will his kingdom stand? You say that I drive out demons by Beelzebul. ¹⁹ But if I drive out demons by Beelzebul, by whom do your sons drive them out? So they will be your judges. ²⁰ Yet if I drive out demons by the finger of God, then the kingdom of God has come upon you.

²¹ "When a strong man, fully armed, guards his own house, his possessions are safe. ²² But when someone stronger attacks him and defeats him, he takes away that man's full armor, in which he had trusted, and divides up his plunder.

²³ "The one who is not with me is against me. The one who does not gather with me scatters. ²⁴ When an unclean spirit goes out of a man, it passes through waterless places, seeking rest, but does not find any. Then it says, 'I will return to my house, the one I left.' ²⁵ When it returns, it finds the house swept and put in order. ²⁶ Then it goes and brings seven other spirits more evil than itself, and they go in and dwell there. The last condition of that man becomes worse than the first."




