An Explanation of Our Communion Practice

Today we are celebrating the Lord's Supper, which is a wonderful gift from our gracious God. In his Word, God teaches that Christians need a proper understanding of the Lord's Supper before receiving it (1 Corinthians 11:27-29). He also tells us that Christians should be completely united before communing together (1 Corinthians 10:17). Therefore, we ask that only members of our fellowship (The Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod and, worldwide, The Confessional Evangelical Lutheran Conference) commune at Trinity.

We do want everyone to commune with us. So that everything may be done decently and in good order (1 Corinthians 14:40), we ask for the opportunity to verify that we are united in our beliefs based on God's Word, and then to celebrate that unity publicly in the Sacrament. If you would like to learn more, please speak to Pastor. Thank you for your understanding of our belief and practice.

FIRST LESSON

1 CHRONICLES **16:23-34**

These are the final verses of a psalm of praise that David wrote for the priests to sing after he successfully rescued the Ark of the Covenant from the Philistines and returned it to Jerusalem. The psalm foresees the spread of God's Word to all nations on earth.

Sing to the LORD, all the earth.

Proclaim the good news of his salvation from day to day.

²⁴ Declare his glory among the nations,

his wonderful acts among all the peoples,

- ²⁵ for great is the LORD and greatly to be praised.He is to be feared above all gods.
- ²⁶ For all the gods of the peoples are not gods at all. But the LORD made the heavens.
- ²⁷ Honor and majesty are before him. Strength and joy are in his place.
- ²⁸ Ascribe to the LORD, you families of the peoples. Ascribe to the LORD glory and strength.
- ²⁹ Ascribe to the LORD the glory of his name.Bring an offering and come before him.Worship the LORD in the splendor of holiness.

SECOND LESSON

JAMES 1:16-21

According to his own good plan, God sends out his Word to save our souls. Our response is thankful, thoughtful, calm, and clean lives.

Do not be deceived, my dear brothers. ¹⁷ Every good act of giving and every perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of the lights, who does not change or shift like a shadow. ¹⁸ Just as he planned, he gave us birth by the word of truth so that we would be a kind of firstfruits of his creations.

¹⁹ Remember this, my dear brothers: Let everyone be quick to listen, slow to speak, and slow to become angry. ²⁰ Certainly, a man's anger does not bring about what is right before God. ²¹ So after getting rid of all moral filthiness and overflowing wickedness, receive with humility the word planted in you. It is able to save your souls.

This is why I said that he takes from what is mine and will declare it to you."

NICENE CREED


We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.






THE WORDS OF INSTITUTION
