# **An Explanation of Our Communion Practice**

Today we are celebrating the Lord's Supper, which is a wonderful gift from our gracious God. In his Word, God teaches that Christians need a proper understanding of the Lord's Supper before receiving it (1 Corinthians 11:27-29). He also tells us that Christians should be completely united before communing together (1 Corinthians 10:17). Therefore, we ask that only members of our fellowship (The Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod and, worldwide, The Confessional Evangelical Lutheran Conference) commune at Trinity.

We do want everyone to commune with us. So that everything may be done decently and in good order (1 Corinthians 14:40), we ask for the opportunity to verify that we are united in our beliefs based on God's Word, and then to celebrate that unity publicly in the Sacrament. If you would like to learn more, please speak to Pastor. Thank you for your understanding of our belief and practice.

# C: Lord, have mercy.



## 1 John 3:13-18

Those who by faith have accepted the invitation to heaven's banquet no longer live for the world's approval, but for true love of their brothers and sisters.

Do not be surprised, brothers, if the world hates you. <sup>14</sup>We know that we have crossed over from death to life, because we love our brothers. The one who does not love remains in death. <sup>15</sup> Everyone who hates his brother is a murderer, and you know that no murderer has eternal life remaining in him. <sup>16</sup> This is how we have come to know love: Jesus laid down his life for us. And we also should lay down our lives for our brothers. <sup>17</sup> Whoever has worldly wealth and sees his brother in need but closes his heart against him—how can God's love remain in him? <sup>18</sup> Dear children, let us love not only with word or with our tongue, but also in action and truth.






## WORDS OF INSTITUTION


