
PASTOR'S GREETING AND INTRODUCTION TO WORSHIP

Confession

- M: Dear friends, let us approach God with a true heart and confess our sins, asking him in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ to forgive us.
- C: Lord of life, I confess that I am by nature dead in sin. For faithless worrying and selfish pride, for sins of habit and sins of choice, for the evil I have done and the good I have failed to do, you should cast me away from your presence forever. O Lord, I am sorry for my sins. Forgive me, for Jesus' sake.
- M: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again. In his great mercy, God made us alive in Christ even when we were dead in our sins. Hear the word of Christ through his called servant: I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the (+) Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C: Amen.
- M: O Lord, open my lips.
- C: And my mouth shall declare your praise.
- M: Hasten to save me, O God.
- C: O Lord, come quickly to help me.

THE WORD

FIRST LESSON

Deuteronomy 11:18-21, 26-28

God's Word is essential to the spiritual welfare of his people. That is why he commands us to make it the guiding principle in our thoughts and actions, our coming and going. God's Word is also the greatest inheritance we can give to our children.

Put these words of mine in your hearts and in your soul, and tie them on your wrists as signs and as symbols on your forehead. ¹⁹ Teach them to your children by talking about them when you sit in your house and when you travel on the road, when you lie down and when you get up. ²⁰ Write them on the doorframes of your houses and on your gates, ²¹ so that your days and the days of your children may be many on the land that the LORD promised to your fathers with an oath, as many as the days that the heavens remain over the earth...

You see, I am placing before you today a blessing and a curse: 27 the blessing, if you listen to the commandments of the LORD your God that I am giving you today, 28 or the curse, if you do not listen to the commandments of the LORD your God and you turn away from the path that I am commanding you today by walking after other gods whom you did not know.

PSALM: 78

Read Responsively

M: O my people, hear my teaching;

C: listen to the words of my mouth.

M: I will utter things from of old,

C: what we have heard and what our fathers have told us.

M: We will not hide them from our children;

C: we will tell the next generation the praiseworthy deeds of the LORD.

M: The LORD decreed statutes for Jacob

C: and established the law in Israel,

M: so the next generation would know them,

C: and they in turn would tell their children.

M: Then they would put their trust in God

C: and would not forget his deeds but would keep his commands.

SECOND LESSON AND SERMON TEXT

Romans 3:21-25a, 27-28

All of us have fallen short of the perfection that God's law demands. By that standard all of us are condemned forever. But God provided a way of righteousness that does not depend on our obedience. God does not ignore our sin, but instead punishes it with Jesus' death on the cross and gives us his Son's righteousness through faith.

But now, completely apart from the law, a righteousness from God has been made known. The Law and the Prophets testify to it. ²² This righteousness from God comes through faith in Jesus Christ to all and over all who believe.

In fact, there is no difference, ²³ because all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God ²⁴ and are justified freely by his grace through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, ²⁵ whom God publicly displayed as the atonement seat through faith in his blood...

What happens to boasting then? It has been eliminated. By what principle—by the principle of works? No, but by the principle of faith. ²⁸ For we conclude that a person is justified by faith without the works of the law.

GOSPEL

Matthew 7:15-29

Faith is only as strong as the truth on which it rests. Only faith built on Christ, the Rock, can withstand the storms of evil unleashed by our world.

"Watch out for false prophets. They come to you in sheep's clothing, but inwardly they are ravenous wolves. ¹⁶ By their fruit you will recognize them. You do not gather grapes from thorn bushes or figs from thistles, do you? ¹⁷ So then, every good tree produces good fruit, but a bad tree produces bad fruit. ¹⁸ A good tree cannot produce bad fruit, and a bad tree cannot produce good fruit. ¹⁹ Every tree that does not produce good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire. ²⁰ So then, by their fruit you will recognize them. ²¹ Not everyone who says to me, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but only the one who does the will of my Father in heaven. ²² Many will say to me on that day, 'Lord, Lord, did we not prophesy in your name and drive out demons in your name and perform many miracles in your name?' ²³ Then I will tell them plainly, 'I never knew you. Depart from me, you evildoers.'

²⁴ "Everyone who hears these words of mine and does them will be like a wise man who built his house on bedrock. ²⁵ The rain came down, the rivers rose, and the winds blew and beat against that house. But it did not fall, because it was founded on bedrock. ²⁶ Everyone who hears these words of mine but does not do them will be like a foolish man who built his house on sand. ²⁷ The rain came down, the rivers rose, and the winds blew and beat against that house, and it fell—it was completely destroyed."

²⁸ When Jesus finished speaking these words, the crowds were amazed at his teaching, ²⁹ because he taught them as one who had authority, and not like their experts in the law.

the holy Christian Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.





C: Thanks be to God.


