
## **PASTOR'S GREETING AND INTRODUCTION TO WORSHIP**

For faithless worrying and selfish pride, for sins of habit and sins of choice, for the evil I have done and the good I have failed to do, you should cast me away from your presence forever. O Lord, I am sorry for my sins. Forgive me, for Jesus' sake.

# THE WORD

#### **FIRST LESSON**

#### Psalm 107:1-9

The Lord's people thank him for all his gracious care.

Give thanks to the LORD, for he is good, for his mercy endures forever. <sup>2</sup> Let the redeemed of the LORD say this, those he redeemed from the hand of the foe, <sup>3</sup> those he gathered from the lands, from the east and from the west, from the north and from the south.

<sup>4</sup> They wandered in the wilderness, in the wasteland. They did not find the way to a city where they could live.
<sup>5</sup> They were hungry and also thirsty, so their lives were draining away.

<sup>6</sup> Then they cried out to the LORD in their distress.
He delivered them from their troubles.
<sup>7</sup> He led them by a straight way to come to a city where they could live.
<sup>8</sup> Let them give thanks to the LORD
for his mercy and his wonderful deeds for all people,
<sup>9</sup> because he satisfies the desire of the thirsty,
and he fills the desire of the hungry with good things.

## SECOND LESSON

## Romans 6:19-23

God provides those who were once slaves to sin with eternal life in Christ and the ability to willingly live in righteousness.

(I am speaking in a human way because of the weakness of your flesh.) Indeed, just as you offered your members as slaves to impurity and lawlessness, resulting in more lawlessness, so now offer your members in the same way as slaves to righteousness, resulting in sanctification.

<sup>20</sup> For when you were slaves of sin, you were free from righteousness. <sup>21</sup> So what kind of fruit did you have then? They were things of which you are now ashamed. Yes, the final result of those things is death. <sup>22</sup> But now, since you were set free from sin and have become slaves to God, you have your fruit resulting in sanctification—and the final result is eternal life. <sup>23</sup> For the wages of sin is death, but the undeserved gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

## **GOSPEL AND SERMON TEXT**

#### Mark 8:1-9

In those days, when there was again a large crowd and they had nothing to eat, Jesus called his disciples and said to them, <sup>2</sup> "I feel compassion for the crowd because they have already stayed with me three days and do not have anything to eat. <sup>3</sup> If I send them home hungry, they will faint on the way. Some of them have come from a long distance."

<sup>4</sup>His disciples replied, "Where can anyone get enough bread to feed these people here in this deserted place?"

<sup>5</sup> He asked them, "How many loaves do you have?"

"Seven," they said.

<sup>6</sup> He commanded the crowd to sit down on the ground. Then he took the seven loaves, gave thanks, and broke them. He gave the pieces to his disciples to distribute to the crowd, and they did so. <sup>7</sup> They also had a few small fish. He blessed them and said that these should be distributed as well. <sup>8</sup> The people ate and were satisfied. They picked up seven basketfuls of broken pieces that were left over. <sup>9</sup> About four thousand men were there. Then he sent them away.

## **APOSTLES' CREED**
