An Explanation of Our Communion Practice

Today we are celebrating the Lord's Supper, which is a wonderful gift from our gracious God. In his Word, God teaches that Christians need a proper understanding of the Lord's Supper before receiving it (1 Corinthians 11:27-29). He also tells us that Christians should be completely united before communing together (1 Corinthians 10:17). Therefore, we ask that only members of our fellowship (The Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod and, worldwide, The Confessional Evangelical Lutheran Conference) commune at Trinity.

We do want everyone to commune with us. So that everything may be done decently and in good order (1 Corinthians 14:40), we ask for the opportunity to verify that we are united in our beliefs based on God's Word, and then to celebrate that unity publicly in the Sacrament. If you would like to learn more, please speak to Pastor. Thank you for your understanding of our belief and practice.



- C: Amen.


LORD, HAVE MERCY - KYRIE

FIRST LESSON

Isaiah 43:1-7

The Messiah draws people from all over the world to himself.

SECOND LESSON

Hebrews 5:7-9

Jesus was obedient to God's law in order to win salvation for us. He is the eternal High Priest who made full payment for our sins. (The "days of his flesh" refers to Jesus' state of humiliation.)

In the days of his flesh, he offered prayers and pleas with loud cries and tears to the one who was able to save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverence. 8 Although he was the Son, he learned obedience from the things he suffered. 9 After he was brought to his goal, he became the source of eternal salvation for everyone who obeys him.

VERSE OF THE DAY

M: Alleluia! The Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many. Alleluia! (Mark 10:45)

GOSPEL AND SERMON TEXT

Iohn 12:20-33

Now there were some Greeks among those who went up to worship at the Festival. ²¹ They came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and asked him, "Sir, we want to see Jesus." ²² Philip went to tell Andrew. Andrew came with Philip and told Jesus.

²³ Jesus answered them, "The time has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. ²⁴ Amen, Amen, I tell you: Unless a kernel of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it continues to be one kernel. But if it dies, it produces much grain. ²⁵ Anyone who loves his life destroys it. And the one who hates his life in this world will hold on to it for eternal life. ²⁶ If anyone serves me, let him follow me. And where I am, there my servant will be also. If anyone serves me, the Father will honor him.

²⁷ "Now my soul is troubled. And what shall I say? 'Father, save me from this hour'? No, this is the reason I came to this hour. ²⁸ Father, glorify your name!"

A voice came from heaven: "I have glorified my name, and I will glorify it again."

²⁹ The crowd standing there heard it and said it thundered. Others said an angel talked to him. ³⁰ Jesus answered, "This voice was not for my sake but for yours.

³¹ "Now is the judgment of this world. Now the ruler of this world will be thrown out. ³² And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself." ³³ He said this to indicate what kind of death he was going to die.


WORDS OF INSTITUTION





Smart Isn't Always Wise

It's a normal question: "What do you want to be when you grow up?"

Grown-ups ask this question when they want to hear what a child is interested in. Is the child interested in airplanes or big trucks? Perhaps she wants to write a book. Maybe he's interested in everything, and it's difficult to narrow down.

The world around us looks up to people who are smart, successful, wealthy. We listen to people who are on TV, who have their own shows, or who have made a living playing sports.

These two ideas are very similar. The question "What do you want to be when you grow up?" is answered by thinking of people we admire—people who lead countries, make millions, and go to the moon.

That's the way our world thinks. We look for success. We look for fame.

But how does God think? Paul tells us: "The message of the cross is foolishness."

When God walked the earth visibly, he didn't choose success. He didn't choose fame, fortune, or a career of playing a game.

He chose crucifixion. Rejection. Betrayal. Death.

Why?

God was showing that he does all the work. Your forgiveness doesn't depend on your skill, your accomplishment, or your money; your forgiveness depends entirely on this Jesus, who gave up his life for you.

Questions to Consider

- What did Jesus do on earth that shows his *power*?
- What did Jesus do on earth that shows his love?
- If Good Friday was the only thing that someone knew about Jesus, what would they think?
- What do you have to do in order to be forgiven?
- Why did God use crucifixion as the tool of our salvation?
- Respond: "I don't want to be a Christian. It sounds foolish that Almighty God would die like that."
