

# An Explanation of Our Communion Practice

Today we are celebrating the Lord's Supper, which is a wonderful gift from our gracious God. In his Word, God teaches that Christians need a proper understanding of the Lord's Supper before receiving it (1 Corinthians 11:27-29). He also tells us that Christians should be completely united before communing together (1 Corinthians 10:17). Therefore, we ask that only members of our fellowship (The Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod and, worldwide, The Confessional Evangelical Lutheran Conference) commune at Trinity.

We do want everyone to commune with us. So that everything may be done decently and in good order (1 Corinthians 14:40), we ask for the opportunity to verify that we are united in our beliefs based on God's Word, and then to celebrate that unity publicly in the Sacrament. 

# THE WORD

# **FIRST LESSON**

# 2 Kings 6:8-17

The Lord delivers Elisha from an enemy king.

Now when the king of Aram was waging war against Israel, he would make plans with his officials, saying, "My camp will be at such and such a place."

<sup>9</sup> But the man of God would send a message to the king of Israel, saying, "Be careful when you pass this place because the Arameans are going down there." <sup>10</sup> So the king of Israel would send scouts to the place that the man of God had pointed out. So the man of God warned him, and he was kept safe—and not just once or twice.

<sup>11</sup> The king of Aram was enraged because of this. He summoned his officials and said to them, "Won't you tell me who of us is for the king of Israel?"

<sup>12</sup> One of his officials said, "No, my lord the king. It is Elisha, the prophet in Israel, who tells the king of Israel the words which you speak in your bedroom."

<sup>13</sup> Then he said, "Go and see where he is. Then I'll send men and capture him."

He was told, "Dothan is where he is."

<sup>14</sup> So he sent horses and chariots and a strong force there. They came at night and surrounded the city. <sup>15</sup> When the man of God's servant got up early and went out, there were soldiers, horses, and chariots surrounding the city. So his attendant said to Elisha, "Oh no, my lord! What will we do?"
<sup>16</sup> He answered, "Don't be afraid, for those who are with us are more than those who are with them."

<sup>17</sup> Then Elisha prayed and said, "O LORD, open his eyes so that he can see." Then the LORD opened the servant's eyes, and he saw that the hills were full of horses and chariots of fire, all around Elisha.

# Mark 6:45-56

The Lord delivers his disciples from the storm. (The fourth watch of the night is 3-6am; Jesus' words "It is I," can also be translated, "I am.")

M: The Gospel of St. Mark, chapter 6.

# C: Glory be to you, O Lord!

Immediately Jesus made his disciples get into the boat and go ahead to the other side, to Bethsaida, while he himself dismissed the crowd. <sup>46</sup> After he had sent them off, he went up the mountain to pray.

<sup>47</sup> When it was evening, the boat was in the middle of the sea, and Jesus was alone on the land. <sup>48</sup> He saw them straining at the oars, because the wind was against them. About the fourth watch of the night, he went to them, walking on the sea. He was ready to pass by them. <sup>49</sup> When they saw him walking on the sea, they thought he was a ghost, and they cried out. <sup>50</sup> They all saw him and were terrified. Immediately he spoke with them and said, "Take courage! It is I. Do not be afraid." <sup>51</sup> Then he climbed up into the boat with them, and the wind stopped. They were completely amazed, <sup>52</sup> because they had not understood about the loaves. Instead, their hearts were hardened.

<sup>53</sup>When they had crossed over, they landed at Gennesaret and anchored there. <sup>54</sup>As soon as they stepped out of the boat, people recognized Jesus. <sup>55</sup>They ran around that whole region and began to bring sick people on their stretchers to where they heard he was. <sup>56</sup>Wherever he entered villages, cities, or the countryside, they were laying sick people in the marketplaces and pleading with him that they might just touch the edge of his garment. And all who touched it were made well.






# WORDS OF INSTITUTION





For college basketball fans, this is the most exciting time of the year: March Madness. By the morning of March 17, a field of 64 teams will be set and the games will begin. Can you imagine what it would be like if you knew before the tournament started that your favorite team was going to win it all? Their best player could be injured, and they could be down by 20 points at halftime, but it wouldn't matter because you knew for certain they would be crowned the champions in the end.

Today Paul is confident we can have something much more important than winning a basketball tournament. It's citizenship in heaven. Most countries insist that you give up your former citizenship before taking up a new one. As Christians we have two places we call home. While we live on earth, our future home is in heaven. This means our homes and time here on earth are just momentary because our true home is in heaven where we will live forever.

We can be sure of our home in heaven because Jesus carried his cross to save us from our sins and gave us the gift of faith. Even though we suffer challenges because of our faith, we are wise to listen to Paul's encouragement to "stand firm in the Lord."

There is no easy way to avoid these challenges. Crosses will be a part of life while in our home on earth. We can find joy in them because we know that Jesus is working them for our good. He uses them to draw us closer to his side and to turn our focus away from the things of this world and back to him.

We can find contentment in any situation because we know that when Jesus returns, he will take us to be with him in heaven. Our bodies will be transformed, and there will be no more pain or suffering. Until we receive our crown in heaven, we ask Jesus to give us the strength and determination to take up our cross and follow him.

# **Questions to Consider:**

What do you like most about your home? Where will you live forever one day because of Jesus? What city and state are you a citizen of? What does Paul mean when he says we are citizens of heaven? Give an example of a cross that you might face as a citizen on earth. How does knowing Jesus already won you victory in heaven help you deal with the crosses you face on earth?
