An Explanation of Our Communion Practice

Today we are celebrating the Lord's Supper, which is a wonderful gift from our gracious God. In his Word, God teaches that Christians need a proper understanding of the Lord's Supper before receiving it (1 Corinthians 11:27-29). He also tells us that Christians should be completely united before communing together (1 Corinthians 10:17). Therefore, we ask that only members of our fellowship (The Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod and, worldwide, The Confessional Evangelical Lutheran Conference) commune at Trinity.

We do want everyone to commune with us. So that everything may be done decently and in good order (1 Corinthians 14:40), we ask for the opportunity to verify that we are united in our beliefs based on God's Word, and then to celebrate that unity publicly in the Sacrament. 
CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

- C: Holy and merciful Father, I confess that I am by nature sinful and that I have disobeyed you in my thoughts, words, and actions. I have done what is evil and failed to do what is good. For this I deserve your punishment both now and eternity. But I am truly sorry for my sins, and trusting in my Savior Jesus Christ, I pray: Lord, have mercy on me, a sinner.

THE WORD

FIRST LESSON

Ezekiel 2:1-7

The Lord's command to Ezekiel is to proclaim what the Lord says, without regard to its acceptance.

He said to me, "Son of man, stand up on your feet, and I will speak with you." ² The Spirit entered into me as he spoke to me and brought me up to my feet. Then I heard him speaking to me.

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³ He said to me, "Son of man, I am sending you to the people of Israel, to disloyal nations, who have been disloyal to me. They and their fathers have rebelled against me to this very day. ⁴ These children of mine are brazen-faced and hard-hearted. I am sending you to them, and you are to tell them that this is what the LORD God says. ⁵ Then, whether they listen or do not listen – for they are a rebellious house – then they will know that a prophet has been among them. ⁶ But you, son of man, do not be afraid of them, and do not be afraid of their words. Even though briers and thorns surround you and you are living with scorpions, do not be afraid of their words, and do not be intimidated by the look on their faces, for they are a rebellious house. ⁷ You are to speak my words to them whether they listen or they do not, for they are a rebellious house."

SECOND LESSON

2 Timothy 2:1-13

Paul commands his protégé Timohty to endure all opposition for the sake of the gospel of Christ, the Savior risen from the dead.

You then, my son, be strong in the grace that is in Christ Jesus. ² Entrust the things you heard from me, in the presence of many witnesses, to faithful men who will also be able to teach others.

³ Share hardships as a good soldier of Christ Jesus. ⁴ No one serving as a soldier gets entangled in the affairs of everyday life. If he does, he will not please the one who enlisted him. ⁵ Also, if someone competes as an athlete, he does not receive a crown unless he competes according to the rules. ⁶ The hardworking farmer should receive a share of the crops first. ⁷ Think about what I am saying, because the Lord will give you understanding in everything.

⁸ Remember Jesus Christ, risen from the dead, a descendant of David, in accordance with my gospel, 9 for which I am suffering, even to the point of being chained like a criminal. But the word of God is not chained. ¹⁰ For this reason I endure all things for the sake of the elect, so that they also may obtain the salvation that is in Christ Jesus, along with eternal glory. ¹¹ This saying is trustworthy:

Indeed, if we have died with him, we will also live with him; ¹² If we endure, we will also reign with him; If we deny him, he will also deny us; ¹³ If we are faithless, he remains faithful, because he cannot deny himself.

Mark 6:1-6

How is it that miracles such as these are performed by his hands? ³ Isn't this the carpenter, the Son of Mary and the brother of James, Joses, Judas, and Simon? And aren't his sisters here with us?" And they took offense at him.

"I don't believe you! That can't be true!" your friend says to you. His reaction shocks you! This is your best friend who has known you as long as you can remember, and he doesn't believe you. You try to explain but it's no use. You leave hurt, confused, and disappointed. If he doesn't believe you, who will? That hurts, doesn't it? And when it comes from your best friend, it rocks your confidence.

Jesus experienced something similar. He, along with his disciples, were visiting Nazareth, the town in which he grew up. Jesus wasn't there to only visit and hang out with family. As the Savior, he was there to preach and teach. That's why people everywhere knew about Jesus. When someone local becomes famous, often the locals are excited and proud to welcome them home. Not so with Jesus. As he was teaching in the synagogue (the church), the people were indeed amazed at what he was saying. Then it turned into questions like, "How can this be the same son of Mary and Joseph that grew up down the street? Who does he think he is?"

They said this about Jesus? They surely did. Those who knew him longest didn't believe him. They knew God's promise to send a Savior. But they just couldn't believe that Jesus was the Savior. To them, he was just one of them and no more.

Now who is amazed? Jesus. He is amazed at their lack of faith. That's why he did very few miracles while there. After he spoke the words for today's devotion, the people became so mad that they ran him out of town and tried to throw him off a cliff. "He simply walked through the crowd and went on his way" (Luke 4:30).

What does this mean for you and for me? God never promised that believing in Jesus would be easy. In fact, he said just the opposite. There are going to be times when even those closest to us may reject what we believe and say. But he also promises to bless our believing and to be with us. Like Jesus, we go on our way and keep believing and telling and sharing and praying. May the Lord bless all who hear the awesome message of God's grace through Jesus. May they join us in hearing and believing!

Questions to Consider:

- Who were the people that couldn't believe Jesus was more than the local son of Mary and Joseph?
- Why do you believe in Jesus?
- Share a time when a friend or someone close to you didn't believe you. Was it something you did or said? What did you do to convince them you were telling the truth?
- The people Jesus was talking to knew about God's promise to send a Savior. Why do you think they still didn't believe him?
- Even when you know it might be hard and that someone you know might not believe you, what promise of God gives you confidence and encouragement to speak up?
- We can share our faith by talking to someone face to face. But what are other ways (without saying a word) that you can influence someone about God's amazing grace?
