
Today's Focus: Jesus raises us from death to life twice: first to the life of faith, then to life in heaven on the Last Day. Our worship follows *Service of the Word*.


CONFESSION OF SINS

THE WORD

FIRST LESSON

Daniel 12:1-3

In perfect harmony, Scripture teaches two resurrections: the first is a resurrection to faith, through which our names are written in the Book of Life. At the second resurrection on the Last Day, all people will rise. Those who were raised to faith will rise to eternal life.

Then at that time, Michael, the great prince who stands over your people, will arise. There will be a time of distress that has not happened from the first time that there was a nation until that time.

At that time your people will be delivered, everyone who is found written in the book. ² Many who are sleeping in the dusty ground will awake, some to everlasting life, and some to shame, to everlasting contempt. ³ Those who have insight will shine like the brightness of the sky, and those who bring many to righteousness will shine like the stars forever and ever.

No, I will live, and I will proclaim the works of the LORD. ¹⁸ The LORD has chastened me severely, but he has not handed me over to death. ¹⁹ Open for me the gates of righteousness. I will enter them. I will give thanks to the LORD. ²⁰ This is the gate to the LORD. The righteous enter it. ²¹ I will give you thanks, because you answered me, and you have become salvation for me. ²² The stone the builders rejected has become the cornerstone. ²³ This is from the LORD. It is marvelous in our eyes. ²⁴ This is the day the LORD has made. Let us rejoice and be glad in it. ²⁵ O LORD, please save us now. O LORD, grant us success. ²⁶ Blessed is he who comes in the name of the LORD. We bless you from the house of the LORD. ²⁷ The LORD is God. and he makes light shine on us. Bind the festival with branches as far as the horns of the altar. ²⁸ You are my God, and I will give you thanks. You are my God, and I will exalt you. ²⁹ Give thanks to the LORD, for he is good, for his mercy endures forever.

SECOND LESSON

Hebrews 9:24-28 Both resurrections – the first to faith and the second to eternal life – are because of Jesus' work.

For Christ did not enter a handmade sanctuary, a representation of the true sanctuary. Instead, he entered into heaven itself, now to appear before God on our behalf. ²⁵ And he did not enter to offer himself many times, as the high priest enters the Most Holy Place year after year with blood that is not his own. ²⁶ Otherwise he would have needed to suffer many times since the creation of the world. But now he has appeared once and for all, at the climax of the ages, in order to take away sin by the sacrifice of himself. ²⁷ And, just as it is appointed for people to die only once and after this comes the judgment, ²⁸ so also Christ was offered only once to take away the sins of many, and he will appear a second time—without sin—to bring salvation to those who are eagerly waiting for him.

M: Let us pray for those who suffer cross and trial:

Almighty and everlasting God, you sent your Son into the world to bear our griefs and to carry our sorrows. Help those who are suffering for your name's sake and who are struggling against temptation so that they may not be overwhelmed with sadness but find relief in your grace, through Christ our Lord.

Proposal Passed at Voters' Meeting

A. The Thanksgiving holiday does not have deep roots in the Christian Church, but is rather a mostly secular, American-made holiday and

B. Thanksgiving Eve worship services at Trinity have been very lightly attended in recent years and C. Trinity's pastors both present and future could more easily visit or host family for Thanksgiving without a worship service and

D. two WELS churches within reasonable driving distance (Bethlehem in Manassas at 8.3 miles and Grace in Falls Church at 14.1 miles) hold Thanksgiving worship services that Trinity members wishing to worship on Thanksgiving could attend and

E. the Biblical teaching of thanksgiving to God for all gifts is already thoroughly covered in Sunday worship by the Lectionary and

F. the holy day of Ascension does have deep historic roots in the Christian Church and

G. no other WELS church in the entire circuit currently holds worship on Ascension Day, so members of neighboring churches wishing to worship on Ascension would now have such an opportunity at Trinity and

H. the significance of Christ's Ascension is not as thoroughly covered in Sunday worship by the Lectionary, be it resolved that

1. Trinity no longer hold Thanksgiving Eve worship

- And be it further resolved that
 - 2. Trinity hold 7pm worship services with Communion on the festival of Ascension each year beginning 29 May 2025 (with possibly a fellowship supper beforehand)

Don't Be Afraid of the Dark! https://wels.net/family-devotion/fd20231115/

Read: 1 Thessalonians 5:1-11

But you, brothers and sisters, are not in darkness so that this day should surprise you like a thief. You are all children of the light and children of the day. We do not belong to the night or to the darkness. So then, let us not be like others, who are asleep, but let us be awake.

1 Thessalonians 5:4-6

Today's devotion is about a very special day—so special, it's the only one of its kind. It's the day when Jesus is going to come back to our world. It hasn't happened yet, and we don't know when it's going to happen exactly. But here's a clue: "the day of the Lord will come like a thief in the night." It will come like someone who is trying to break into your home. Why is nighttime the best time of the day to do that? Because it's dark, and a thief hopes you're asleep and won't be able to see him. That is a scary thought! A lot of people are afraid of the dark because they are afraid of what they can't see.

If you can't see this big day of Jesus' return, should you be afraid? Absolutely not! Today's devotion gives three really good reasons why you shouldn't be afraid.

We are children of the light and of the day. We don't fear the dark because we don't live in the darkness. We live in the light of Jesus! If we are near to Jesus, we can be surrounded by darkness, but it can't touch us. He is always there with us.

We have faith and love as a breastplate and the hope of salvation as a helmet. A breastplate is a piece of armor that protects your heart. A helmet protects your head. If you are wearing those two things, you are covered! Our faith in Jesus and what he did for us is like a breastplate. The love that he shows to us, self-sacrificing love, covers and protects us. And we have the hope of salvation! Paul says God has salvation waiting for us on the last day, not punishment. Because Jesus died for us, we get to look forward to living with him. So we should see salvation coming!

We have encouragement from each other. If you are ever afraid of that coming day, just turn to another follower of Jesus for some strength and encouragement. And share that same kind of encouragement with them! Build each other up with the good news that we can look forward to salvation!

Questions to Consider:

Sometimes darkness is scary. Are you afraid of the dark? Give at least one reason why.

The next time you are in the dark, what is one thing you can remember in your head that will help to lessen your fear?

Paul mentions we should wear "faith and love as a breastplate" and "the hope of salvation as a helmet." How do faith, love, and hope protect us in a dark world?

Paul calls us "children of the light and of the day." Does that fact make it harder or easier to stay awake and clear-minded?

After today's devotion, what would you say to someone who says, "We don't know when Jesus will come back, so we shouldn't think about it at all"?

Why is it important for Christians to encourage and build each other up before Jesus returns?
